

BILLY SHEEHAN MOD for BC1 DESCRIPTION & OPERATION

The BC1 Billy Sheehan modification helps provide the long sustain and lead guitar-like tone that has become Billy's trademark. This is accomplished by:

- Two additional gain stages on channel 1 for very high distortion and sustain.
- E.Q. reconfiguration removing almost all of the bass from channel 1, and radically boosting the midrange and treble.
- 3. The high gain distortion of the B.S. mod is typically used by setting up channel 2 clean and "bass-y" for regular rhythm playing, combined with channel 1 overdriven for solos. This is accomplished with a Pearce FS-2 footswitch.
- Due to the radical reconfiguration of E.Q. and gain, channel l is relatively impractical for "NORMAL" playing.
- 5. Due to the extreme gain of channel 1, the overall noise is correspondingly increased, so use with a noise gate or Hushtype noise reduction is recommended.

A standard control set up is as follows: (Mixed Input, @ 0 dB)

Chan.	MODE	DRIVE	BASS	MID	FREQ.	TREBLE	VOLUME
CH 1:	Boost	10	0	+5	1KHz	9	2-8
CH 2:	Norm	2-4	7	+1	200Hz	6	9

Balance the volumes of the two channels by setting first channel 2 (clean) to desired volume, and then combine Ch 1 & 2, and adjust level to suit.
